During her time in the program, she learned coding, programming, and lab procedures. Though she did not have experience in these areas, her supervisor provided her with the necessary training to complete the tasks at hand. The flexibility of scheduling was another perk to the program. At 18, she was already a Team Leader at Whataburger. Following the program, at only 19, she received a promotion to Assistant Manager. In her new role, she advocates the program to her co-workers

and encourages them to apply. Currently, she is on track to graduate with her Associates in Business Administration this spring, with hopes of becoming a General Manager.
